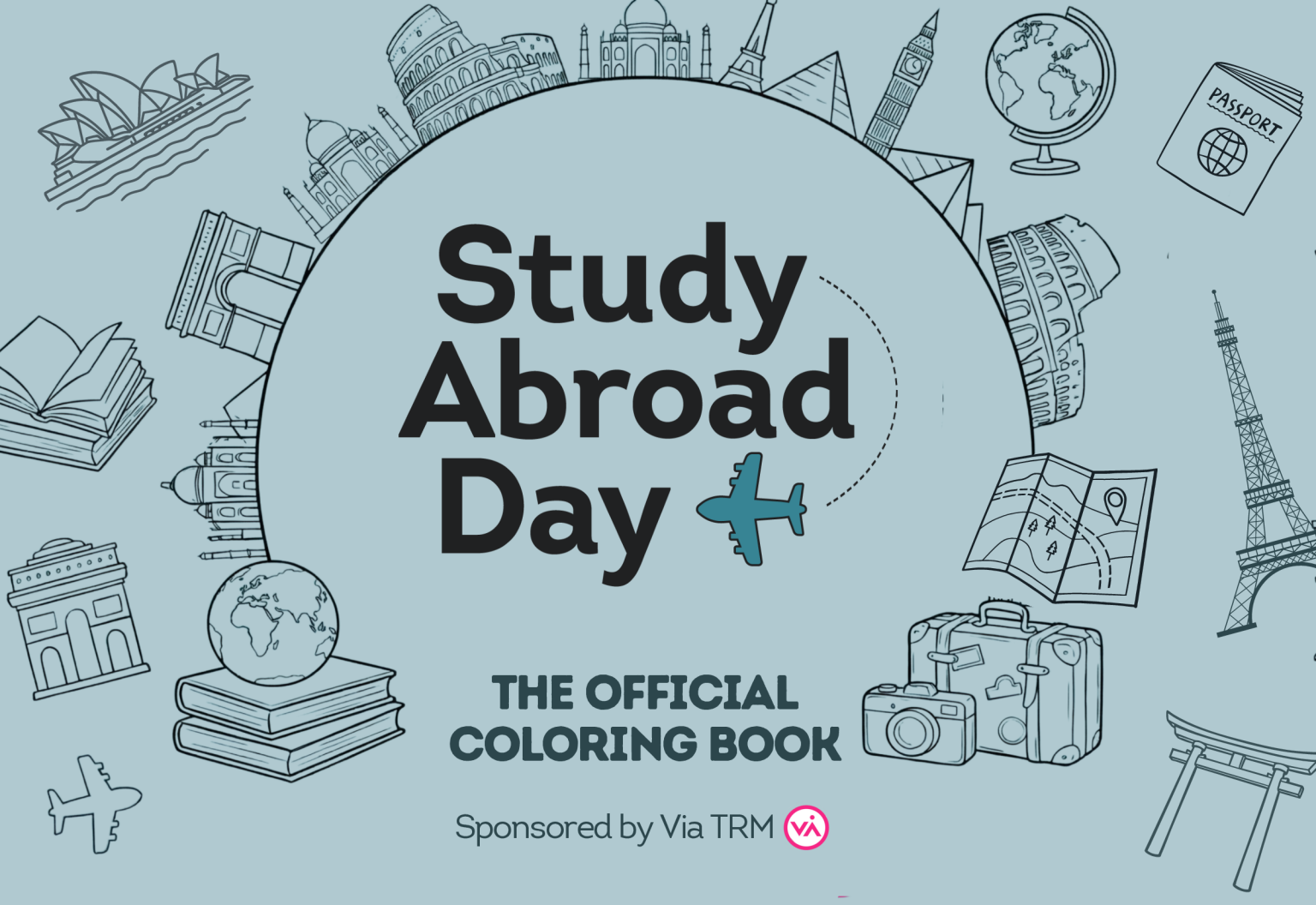


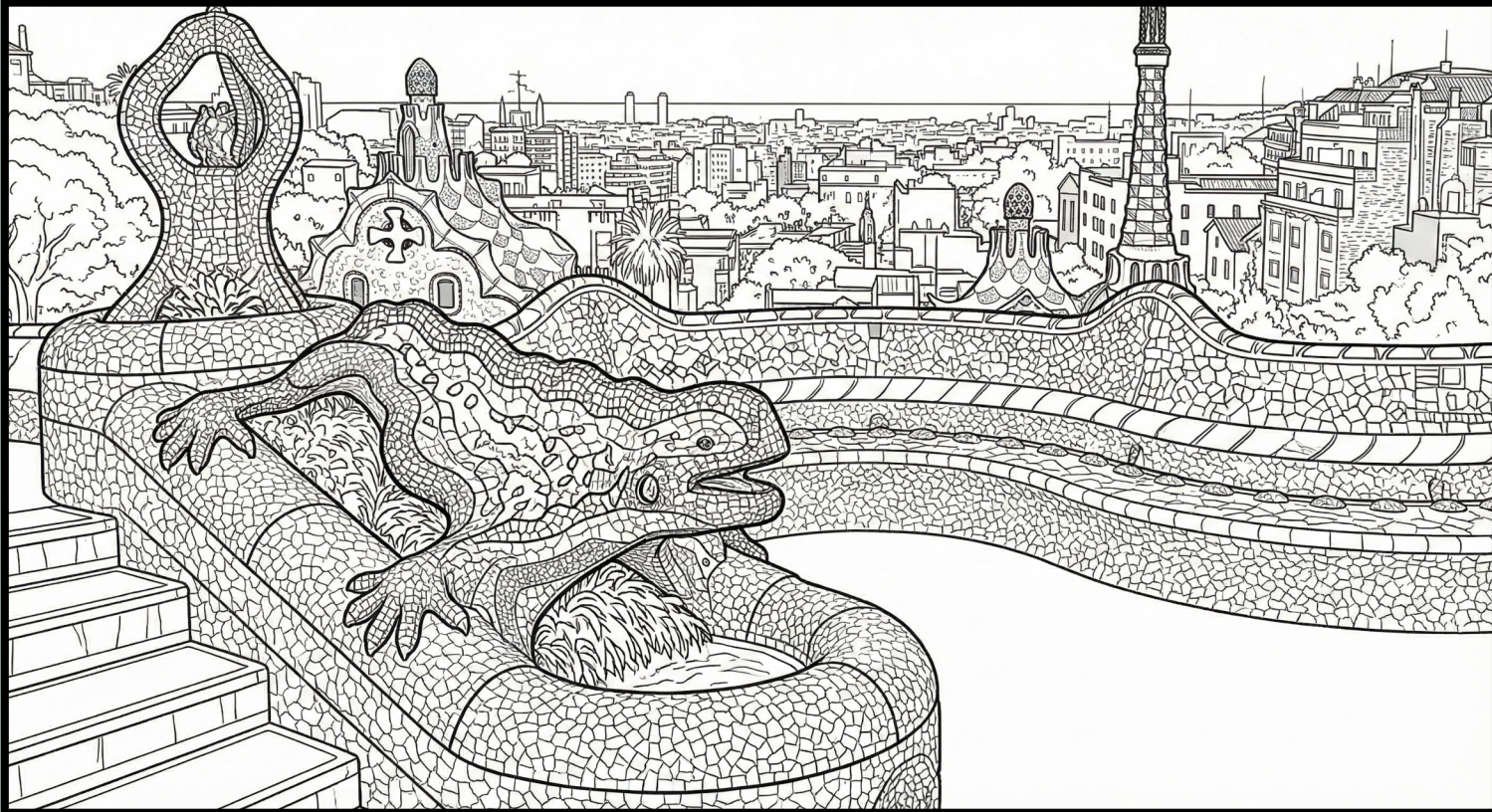

Dublin, Ireland

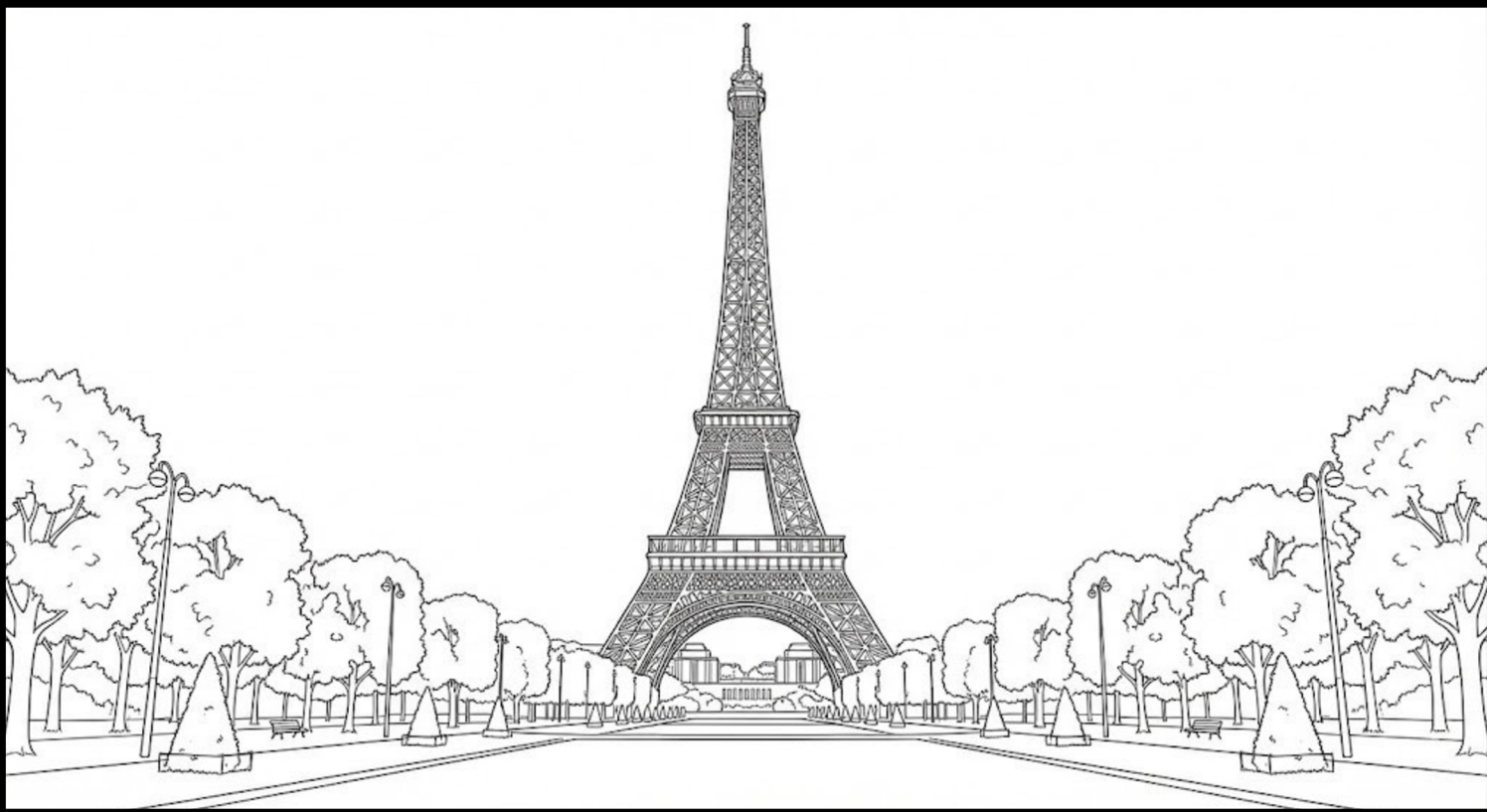

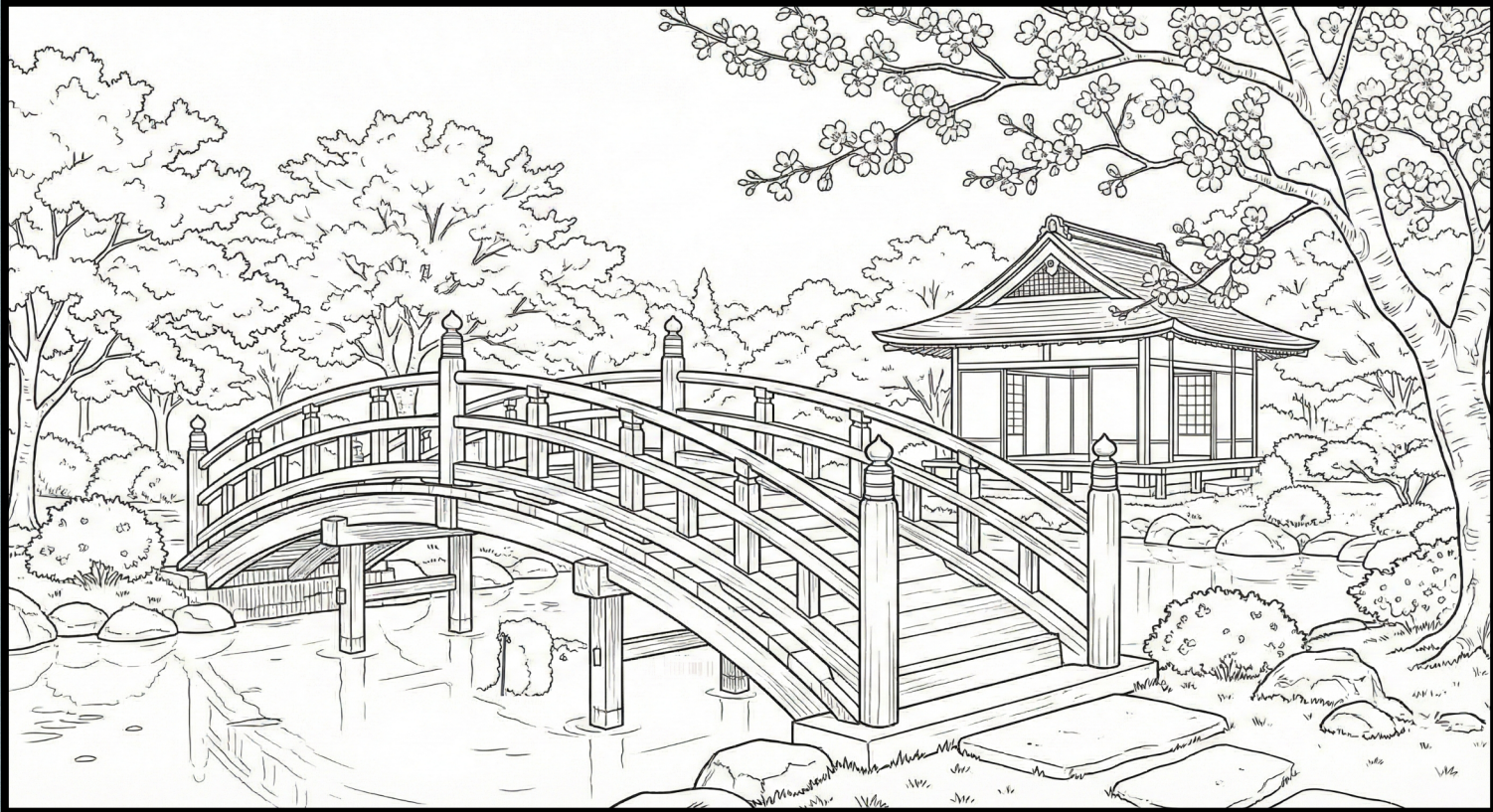
Fun Fact: The Eiffel Tower was originally intended as a temporary structure for the 1889 World's Fair but was saved by its usefulness as a radio tower.

Seoul, South Korea

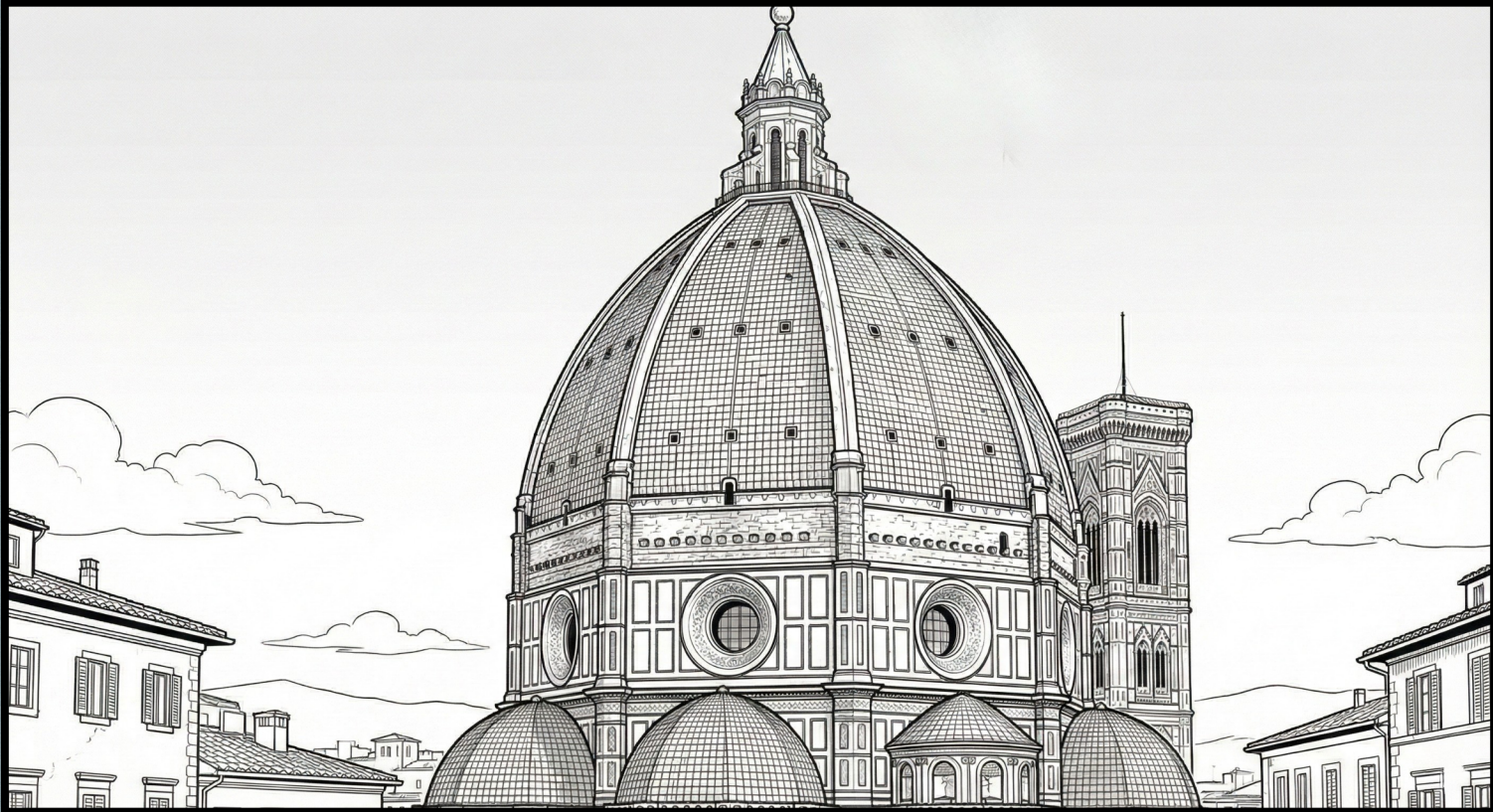

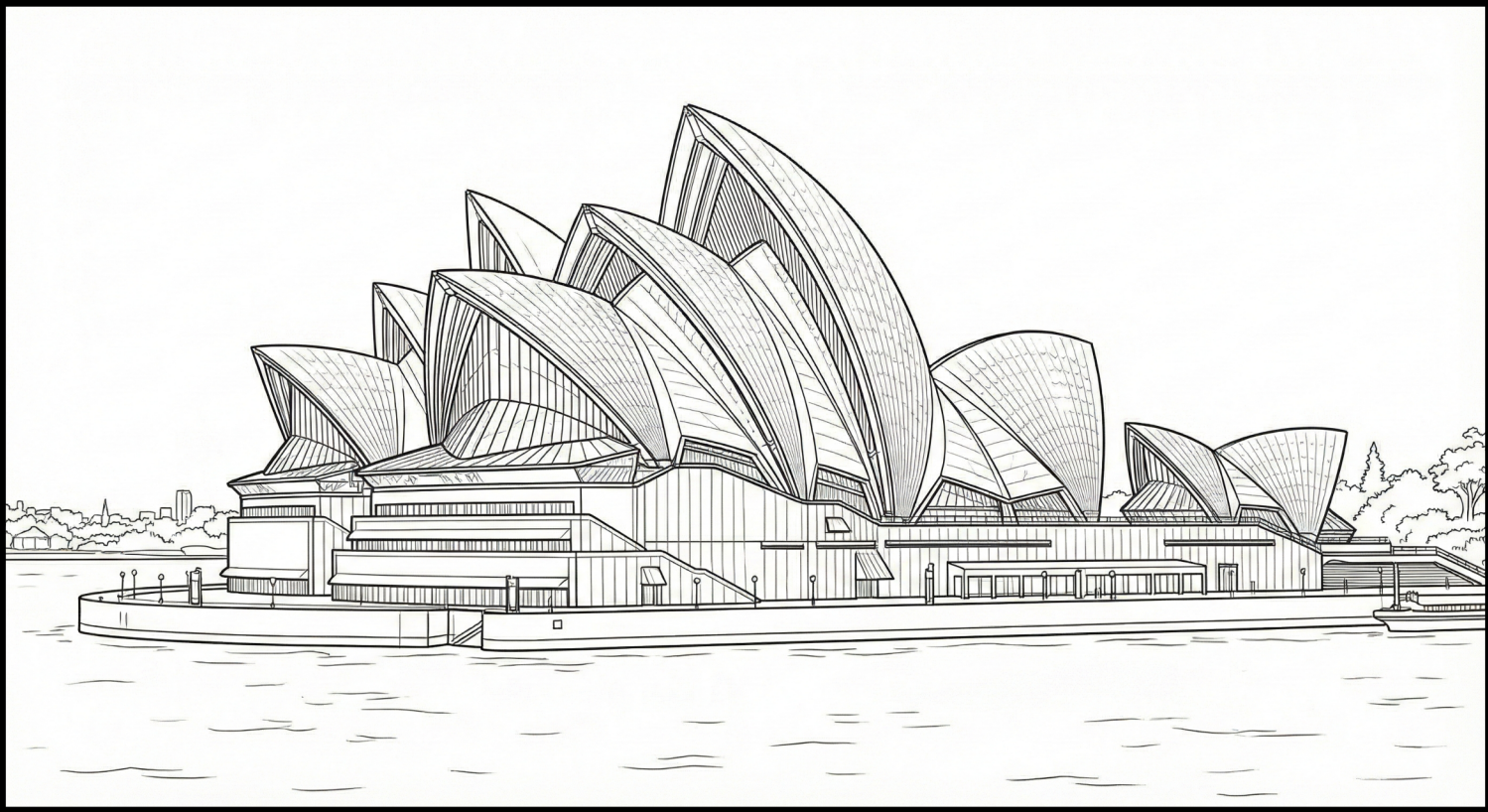
